2. Reading Like a Teacher

The 100% Accuracy Challenge

We want you to make a video of you reading.


1. We want you to choose at least one book and read it like a teacher – that means reading it fluently, making it sound interesting, not reading it too fast, looking up at your audience from time to time as you read it.
2. Read it like a teacher. Make a video of you reading the book clearly and confidently, just like a teacher. Decide who you are going to send your video to and ask them what they think about your reading.

For example, you could say:

“This is the book that I’m going to read for you.”

e.g. *I’m going to find a dinosaur.*

“What did you think of my reading?”




3. What Do You Think of My Pictures?


We have drawn three picture frames. We want you to draw three pictures, one picture to go inside each frame. Draw your pictures to show three things that happened in one of the books that you have read on the order that the things happened in the book.

4. Find the Phonics

Phonics is all about the sounds that letters make. We want you to find examples of phonics in the books that you have read.

We have made a list of examples of the types of phonics that are in the words in our books.

Choose the types phonic sounds and blends from the list that you are going to find. You could choose to find 3 or 5 or even all ten. You can choose.

The we want you to tell us the word that you found with an example of the type of phonics and the page you have found them.



Name of the phonics feature	Example
CVC word: a consonant – vowel – consonant	jam
Consonant: a letter that is not a vowel	'k', 'd' 's' and lots more
Vowel: the letters a-e-i-o-u	at, in,
'y' that makes it's own sound sometimes	ready
A consonant blend: two consonants that make a single sound	'tr' as in triangle or 'ch' as in cheese, 'ld' as in cold
A vowel-consonant blend	'ar' as in garden
A vowel digraph: 2 vowels that make a single sound	'ea' as in tea, or 'oa' as in toast
A split digraph: a vowel-consonant-vowel combination that makes a single sound	'ake' as in bake, or 'ace' as in space.
Three-letter combinations that make a single sound	'ing' and in going or 'ang' as in triangle.
Four letter combinations that make a single sound	'tion' as in station, or 'cial' as in special.

5. Ten-Turn-Tally

This game is a game that is about luck and skill... and counting, and reading words.

You will need dice to play and the books that you have read.

You are going to roll the die. You can have ten turns.

Every time you roll the die, you have to find a word with the same number of letters in it that show on the die when you roll it.


For example, if you throw a number 3, you have to find a word with three letters in it and say it correctly.

That sounds too easy, so when you throw a number 6, you can say and find any word that has 6 or more letters in it.

Hope you get a lot of sixes.

Write the number of letters in each word and tally then up after ten turns.

After 10 turns, add up the total number of letters that have been in your ten words.


6. Sentence Search

What can you see in sentences?

We have made a list of grammar and punctuation that can be used in sentences.

We want you to search sentences and find examples of the types of grammar and punctuation. Tell us what page you found them on.

And then we're going to ask you to tell us your favourite sentence in the book.

7. Word Lists


Guess how many words in the word lists I can read now?

8. Three Minute Spelling Challenge

Choose 8-10 words from the book you've read. You will need someone to help you in this activity.


Choose who is going to help you. Get them to write them on the list on the next page, making sure that each word is spelt correctly.

Ask them to say the words one at a time. We want to see how many you can spell correctly in **3 minutes**.

This is your first practice.

Practice to learn more words. The person who is helping you is going to ask you to write the words again but they will only do this when you choose.

The thing is though, they won't say the words in the same order, but they will make sure that they say them all in 3 minutes. We want to see how many words you can spell in 3 minutes.

9. I Got Inspired: Creative Projects


Get inspired and choose a project. You decide what you want to do and how you're going to do it. When you've done it, share and then record what people said about your project.

10. Invent the Game


So what we want you to do is **invent your own game**.

Some ideas are:

- You could write a word on each card in the four colours, put them in piles and then depending on what colour you land on as you go around the board game, you would pick a word in that colour and say it;
- You could make it a grammar game and write punctuation marks on each card and when you land on a colour you have to find an example of that punctuation;
- You could make it a spelling game...

The ideas are yours. You can invent any game you want. This is a big challenge, so ask somebody to help you.
